t has been a calm couple of months for some of our boxing clubs as the summer holidays are upon us and our volunteers are taking a well earned rest. With the introduction of the first ever competitive women's boxing event at the London 2012 Olympic Games, we piloted a number of ladies-only sessions across 3 clubs. These were Chelmsford ABC, Vange and Pitsea ABC and Chadwell St Mary ABC. The sessions have proved very popular and we hope this may result in

finding another star and national champion to follow in the footsteps of Nina Smith.

We already have numerous county fixtures and championship rounds being staged in Essex which can all be found on www.abae.co.uk/eastern.

Our boxing clubs have a great advantage over other areas across England, with access to more than just boxing through the Essex Boys and Girls Clubs. Last year we had over 40 boxers in the EBGC Cross Country, and 2 boxers and a coach from Canvey Island ABC completed the EBGC Three Peaks Challenge in under 24 hours. This year is a great time to get involved in more EBGC activities with the Jailbreak Fundraiser coming up in October, Cross County in the New Year, the County Skipping Championships, the Three Peaks Challenge in June and Stubbers Adventure Centre always open for team building and fun days out.



We have boxing clubs all across Essex linking with other partners in the form of local clubs, schools, further education establishments, community programmes and local authorities. With recent news about the riots nationwide I don't think it was luck that very little trouble was caused in Essex. It is our great volunteers that keep inspiring young people week in, week out across the county that is making the difference. I hope you have all enjoyed some rest and are looking forward to the new season as much as I am!

NCS: SUMMER OF SUCCESS!

Young people from across the county have taken advantage of a fantastic opportunity piloted by the Government this summer to take part in an exciting programme called NCS being run by Essex Boys and Girls Clubs in partnership with Catch 22.

NCS gives 16 year olds (young people coming out of year 11) the chance to take part in a summer programme that is challenging, fun and develops skills and confidence. The programme has been piloted in Thurrock, Southend and Braintree and has so far been a fantastic success. It runs over a three week period, starting with a week of outdoor activities and challenges at High Row, the EBGC residential centre in the Lake District. week is designed to improve teamwork and confidence. The two day expedition was a great experience with the groups proud to 'grab a peak' and learn camp skills while sleeping under the stars for

two nights in bivvy bags. Other activities during the trip included ridge walking up Sharp Edge, climbing and abseiling, a gully bash and waterfall climb, as well as canoeing and a river cross.



The following week the groups met at Stubbers Adventure Centre for a further week under canvas to take part in activities and to plan a community volunteering project. These projects included a beach clean at Grays beach and the transformation of a walled garden at Stubbers Adventure Centre by volunteers from Thurrock. The Southend and Braintree contingent

transformed the grounds of Cardfields Environmental Centre at Hatfield Peverel, which included refurbishment of the BMX track ready for future use by schools and youth groups. A second group from Thurrock arranged visits to homes for the elderly at Collins House in Stanford Le Hope and Heatherbrook in Romford where they helped with various maintenance projects and built relationships with the residents.

RYLA WEEK JACK PETCHEY

Rotary Young Leadership Awards, or RYLA, is a scheme designed to identify and train young leaders. Rotary's partnership with EBGC has now entered its fifth year. Young people are nominated to be on the scheme by Rotarians and then have a day at Stubbers completing various tasks. Those who excel are then chosen to go for further training on a residential course at High Row in the Lake District, which is run by EBGC.



This year 14 young people were selected to go away on the residential on the 8th August and they took part in a variety of challenging activities over the four days. Fortunately the first days were dry and sunny, so the mountain biking and ghyll scrambling proved to be great fun. Visiting the Lake District has to include climbing a mountain so, in slightly more inclement weather, they set off to conquer High Pike, Knott and Carrock Fell and returned somewhat damp!

Having explored pratical and theoretical styles of leadership, everyone had excelled in some way. This years Rotary Young Leader Award; decided by staff and the group, went to *Ayomi Tucker* and she will be awarded the 2011 Trophy at a reunion in September.

Since the beginning of March 2011 12 clubs in the south of the county have been taking part in our new Jack Petchey Club Support Scheme. These are AB Phab, Crown & Manor, East Tilbury Youth Club, Frenford Clubs, Linford Wanderers, Loughton Youth Project, Rainham Royals, Seabrook Rise, SNAC, St. Cedds, St. Stephens Youth Club and Theydon Bois Youth Club.

The scheme is backed by The Jack Petchey Foundation and the YMCA George Williams College. It is designed to not only get the views from members in clubs but also involves putting their views into action and getting them to take true ownership in their clubs. To date it has been well received by both clubs and young people.

The young leaders in the clubs have had the chance to complete their Level 2 pre graduates course in Informal and Community Education run by the YMCA George Williams College, and we currently have 12 participants on the course with more to follow in the future.

As a result of the scheme we welcome Ryan Keen as a trainee at EBGC starting in September.
