## FOG CASTS SPOOKY AURA OVER NIGHT EX

The fog descended over Great Yeldham for Essex Boys and Girls Clubs' annual Night Exercise on Saturday 19th November.



Fifty-two intrepid young people from *Linford Wanderers, The Ashdon Hangout, Wickham St. Pauls, Sampford YC, St. Cedds, Last Resort Youth Group, The Massive Project* and the *Senior Members Club*, arrived at 7.30pm to be welcomed by Conservative MP for Braintree District, Mr. Brooks Newmark, before setting out into the fog on a thrilling 4 mile course across the farm.

The young people were split into teams of four or five and set off at intervals with just a map and torch to navigate the challenging route. Along the course the teams completed 10 different activities at 'checkpoints', as well as a two and a half mile rope trail through 'Wren Park Wood'. Activities included 'Hang Tough', 'the Slippery Log', Rifle Shoot, Tree Climb and the Rope Swing amongst others; and time bonuses or penalties were awarded in accordance with success or failure at each task.

## NEWS FROM RINGSIDE

The Clubs for Young People Class A and Class C National Boxing Finals, hosted and run by EBGC, were settled on Thursday 24th November at Harlow Greyhound Stadium, Essex. The Class A finals for 15 and 16 year olds were boxed over 12 different weights and the Class C finals for 17 and 18 year olds were boxed over 13 weights. Contenders from all over England and Wales had taken part in as many as 6 previous stages of the competition to get an opportunity to contend for the prestigious national titles.

Representing the Essex ABA, Karl Davis (*Billericay ABC*) was up second to face James Blenkinsop (*Phil Thomas ABC, Middlesbrough*). Karl had previously put on a great display in the Semi-Finals and started this evening with the same power, speed and skill. Unfortunately Davis was just edged out by the North of England Champion and lost by a score of 16-10. Karl proved that he can more than hold his own at a national level and did Billericay and Essex very proud.



Professionals Tony Conquest and Jason Rowland were in attendance as well as former European Champion and Sky Sports Pundit Spencer Oliver. Spencer was filming for Sky Sports Ringside which airs on

Thursday evenings on Sky Sports 1. Former World Featherweight Champion Barry McGuigan also made an appearance and was very impressed by James Branch (*Repton Boys Club, London*) who outclassed his opponent from Sheffield City with a huge margin of 26-1.

Chris Ali (*Repton Boys Club*) won the under 57Kgs national title against Ramsey Nasser (*Sheffield Lane Top*) with yet another impressive performance leading to a score of 27-12.

The atmosphere was elevated in anticipation of the Class C under 67Kgs between Johnny Saunders (*Rumbles ABC, Kent*) and Stephen Lewis (*Long Lane ABC, Liverpool*). Saunders waited for Lewis and used his counter punching skills to outscore the Merseyside boxer for the first three rounds. Lewis then found his range to force the bout to a dramatic 4<sup>th</sup> round. However the Kent boxer managed to stay composed and do just enough to hold on and win the bout with a close margin of 18-15.

The evening culminated with the Super Heavyweights and unbeaten Lawrence Okolie (*Lion ABC, London*)

muscling out Harry Armstrong (*Apollo ABC, Torquay*) with a win of 20-13.

Essex Boys and Girls Clubs staged every round of the championships bar the Semi-Finals and that also included stepping in to host the London Youth Round at late notice to give boxers across London the opportunity to compete in these Championships.

New affiliates to Essex Boys and Girls Clubs, West Ham ABC took 5 boxers to the Class B finals in Leeds the following night. Luke Saunders and Tommy Beaney came away victorious against their northern opponents to give Essex Boys and Girls Clubs two more National Champions.

**WHEN?** Taking place in the first three weeks of April and September 2012 exact dates and times will be confirmed once numbers are finalised

and appropriate flights are booked.

**WHERE?** In a sentence.... flying from London into Kathmandu, you will spend a couple of days in the bustling capital before trekking out into the Himalayas 10,000 feet up to the remote mountain village of Barpak, throw in some white water rafting on the trek back before returning to Kathmandu for a day of bartering with local traders before flying back home!

**WHO?** If you are aged 16-21 and are part of Essex Boys and Girls Clubs (having either taken part on one of our courses or a member at a Club) then you can apply to be a member of the team for this once in a life time trip!

**HOW?** First you need to find out more about it by attending one of our information evenings with your parent

or guardian. Then if your application is accepted you will take part in planning, training and fundraising for the trip assisted along the way by EBGC staff.

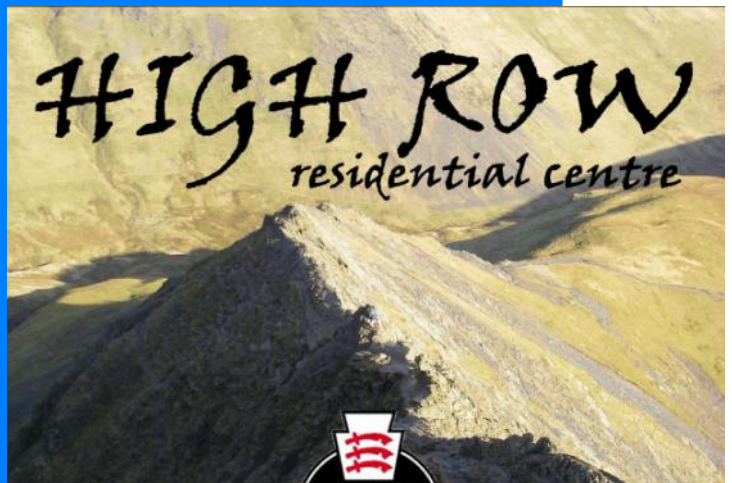
