Southend Utd. on Thursday 27th January at the impressive Basildon Bowl pitch in Gloucester Park, Basildon. In the first half the lack of football played over the previous two months was evident as EBGC conceded in the first five minutes to a soft goal resulting from confusion amongst the defence as they attempted to spring the offside trap.

However after the initial shock of conceding so early the boys soon settled down and began to string some passes together. Despite a period of exceptional play from EBGC they still could not find the back of the net and were guilty of a couple of glaring misses. Southend however were slightly more ruthless in front of goal and a penalty as well as a goal that looked suspiciously offsidemeant they went in at the break 3-0 up.

In the second half signs of intelligent play and exceptional work rate were encouraging. EBGC conceded just one goal as fitness began to tell in the latter stages, with the match finishing 4-0.

Next up was the Ipswich Town match played at their state of the art training facilities on Playford Road. With a lot of new faces in the team EBGC started very well, defending stoutly and keeping the ball well in midfield. Ipswich took the lead after about 15 minutes with a superbly struck free-kick from the edge of the box. EBGC worked incredibly hard to break down the Ipswich team but it was difficult not to marvel at the regimental discipline displayed by the home side as they broke down play and counter-attacked guickly and effectively. At half-time the score was 3-0 to Ipswich. However EBGC continued to give them a run for their money, closing down in all areas of the pitch and defending stubbornly. EBGC were incredibly unlucky not to score on a couple of occasions on the break, however as the lads tired Ipswich began to take control.

Despite the final score of 6-0, the players can be extremely proud of their efforts. Opportunities to play against sides like Ipswich Town and Southend Utd. are unique and it was evident from their performance that all the players appreciated this. The most important thing to take from the day was the experience, and judging by the reactions and sportsmanship both on and off the pitch, this was the case.

EDITORIAL

BRENTWOOD BOXERS A BIG HIT WITH WEEKEND SHOPPERS

The club treated shoppers in High Chelmer to a display of their skills, and they were able to lace up a pair of gloves and give boxing a go with some of the Brentwood coaches.

An international match was projected onto a big screen to give over 160 armchair judges a chance to have a go at scoring a bout for themselves, and Boxfituk.com donated pairs of gloves and skipping ropes as prizes. Participants were given a quick demonstration of how to use clickers to keep score, and scoring blows were explained for the uninitiated.

Mayor Councillor Arnott presented Brentwood Youth ABC with the Essex Boys and Girls Clubs Cross-Country Boxing Challenge Trophy that they won at the start of the year, running against other clubs in Essex.

Councillor Arnott said: "I am really behind boxing as a sport. It gives young people an opportunity to channel aggression and hyperactivity, while at the same time giving them goals to aim for and a great way to get fit."

Former Frenford member gets call up to World Cup Squad!

Ravi Bopara has earned a call up to the England Cricket team for the World Cup due to be played in India this Easter. Bopara will replace the prolific Eoin Morgan, who has had to withdraw from the squad due to a broken finger.

Ravinder Singh Bopara joined Frenford Club in 1995; "Frenford had a great influence on my life, and taught me to be more responsible. I was lucky to be given the opportunity to learn cricket and improve my skills using the clubs facilities."

Ravi played for the Essex Boys and Girls Clubs Representative Cricket team across the 1998 and 1999 seasons, his highlight being a knock of 77 against Billericay Cricket Club on the 1st September 1999, a game that EBGC won by 40 runs.

Ravi made his first class debut for Essex in May 2002 and by 2003 he was a regular in the England U19 team. His first first-class century came in the 2005 season, during which he scored 880 firstclass runs.

This will be Ravi's second World Cup tournament after playing an important part in the 2007 competition, breaking the ODI records for the highest 5th wicket partnership and the highest 8th wicket partnership. His 52 from 53 balls against Sri Lanka brought England to within 3 runs of winning but it was not to be as he was bowled from the last ball of the game.

The call up is a chance for Ravi to show what he is capable of after a stuttering England career so far. He has the support of everyone at EBGC and we are confident that he will embrace this chance to showcase his considerable talent.
