CHAIRMANS REPORT - Jonathan Douglas-Hughes OBE DL

2019 has been a good year for EBGC. Maes y Lade, High Row, and Layer Marney Outdoors have all been great successes. One of my personal highlights was attending the tree planting at Maes y Lade when a small forest was planted at the centre, with a tree planted for every affiliated club to mark the 80th anniversary of EBGC. Young people and adult volunteers from all over the county and East London planted over 300 trees to mark the occasion and then took part in a range of outdoor activities. I hope that the weather and conditions will be kind to the whips that were planted and enable a wonderful wood to develop over the coming years. When your club next visits the centre you will be able to find your tree. The event was so much of a success that we will run it again in 2020 and look at other parts of the site to plant and develop.

The events programme for clubs was as full and well supported as usual. As trustees we are focused on the fact that EBGC exists to serve the needs of its member clubs. This is something that I have been extremely keen to ensure that we do over the 30+ years that I have been Chairman. Getting out into the outdoors I believe gives young people a sense of well being and purpose. Competition against others enables young people to deal with winning and losing in a controlled environment. What we do at EBGC is build upon and enhance the work that is done in clubs to build resilient and capable young people ready to play their part as adults in the world around them.

There were many new additions to the programme in the last year. Respect became a national programme. Our bushcraft programme has expanded to other European countries and we have developed links with the World Federation of Youth Clubs, with the aim to provide more international opportunities for our members. We continue to provide new activities which interest a wide range of young people not only in all forms of outdoor activities but also in creative and artistic pursuits. We strive to provide something for everyone. I always say if there is something that you think we should be doing for your young people then you only have to ask and we will endeavor to provide it.

My personal thanks to the Association's executive committee for their continued support and contribution to our work. You may not see them a great deal however they are behind the scenes husbanding EBGC's resources to be used in the best way possible. My thanks also to all the volunteers who support our work and the work of clubs. They are the keystone to our entire operation and without them our work just wouldn't exist.

DIRECTORS REPORT - Martin Solder

2019 was another great year for EBGC. The Youth Investment Fund club development programme saw four inclusive additional needs clubs become established and start to deliver some great programmes. Our Respect programme grew again and through the Youth Endowment Fund we have started a 2 year development of the programme to see if its success in Essex would translate into successes in the rest of the country and in Wales as they funded programmes to take place in Manchester, Bristol, South Yorkshire, Lancashire and Wales. The programmes themselves will be evaluated by IpsosMORI and hopefully at the end of it we will have valuable evidence of the success of the programmes. In addition to these programmes we also were successful in attracting EU Funding through Erasmus to develop our Bushcraft programme in Cyprus, Italy, Romania, and Eire.

Also in 2019 we reengaged with the NCS programme and will be delivering this programme again for the foreseeable future. However this doesn't mean that we have forgotten our clubs and our members as all that we do is aimed at making sure that our members and Clubs get the best service and programme of activities that we can possibly deliver. The National Lottery Reaching Communities funding has meant that Rebecca and her team of sports, arts and club support officers have been able to continue support for clubs and young people.

Maes y Lade outdoor centre has gone from strength to strength. With good usage by our groups from canoe test training to tree planting a host of young people from Essex have benefitted from taking part in outdoor programmes in the wilds of the Brecon Beacons national park with activities such as Gorge Walking and Caving to Canoeing and hillwalking. If your club hasn't yet visited Maes y Lade make sure it is on the agenda to do so in the near future and take advantage of the association bursary scheme to do so.

High Row our self catering outdoor centre in the Lake District has had a new kitchen fitted and is superbly based on the edge of the North East Lakes to be able to walk out the door onto the fells and is equally distant from Keswick, Penrith and Carlisle for all local amenities. It is another resource for clubs to use and if you want to put a programme together then just speak to the staff in our office and we will be more than happy to help this happen.

On a more local level Layer Marney Outdoors has continued to develop for our club members. The venue hosted our Night Exercise at the backend of the year and has been extensively used for weekends and day visits throughout the summer months. If your club would like to have a tailor made adventure programme delivered on their doorstep then speak to Bruce in the office who will be more than happy to arrange this for you.

Throughout the year there have been many highlights both sporting and creative. Rep Football, Cricket, Boxing, Outdoor adventure, have all featured highly and are reported on elsewhere in this review. EBGC is committed to ensuring that Clubs receive fantastic, first rate, exciting programmes for their members to enable them to grow and develop into positive adult members of society. We have aimed to do this for the last 80 years and we will continue to do this for the next 80 years. The need for clubs has not changed in this time and certainly this looks no different in the future. Camaraderie, a sense of belonging, a family, achievement, a purpose and just belonging to something in their local community are all reasons that young people join and are members of clubs. It is what we have done for decades and we will continue to do this well into the future.

YOUTH INVESTMENT FUND

Our 3-year Youth Investment Fund project started in 2017 when we were awarded c.£600,000 to develop new inclusive youth clubs in Barking and Dagenham, Havering and Redbridge. Since then, across the 3 boroughs, we have established 4 thriving clubs; engaged with 2,600 young people through a range activities promoting the clubs; and there have been over 3,200 visits to the clubs since they opened. The clubs offer their members a



variety of activities, including sport, arts and crafts, gardening, as well as trips away from the club to help members broaden their horizons. Although the funding has come to an end, that certainly isn't the end of the project, we are continuing to support the clubs to become fully self-sufficient, and to develop a diverse and varied programme. The clubs cater for over 30 types of additional needs, so if you'd like to find out how you can make your club more inclusive then please feel free to get in touch!

NATIONAL LOTTERY COMMUNITY FUND

We were excited to receive funding from the National Lottery Community Fund to expand the Rural programme Essex wide! This meant we are able to continue our work supporting clubs. This also meant were able to employ a new Arts Officer, Lynsey Roper, who I am sure many of you have seen at your club or at EBGC events. Lynsey will be focusing on everything that comes under the arts umbrella from drama to arts and crafts and will be organising events, training and supporting club sessions. Lynsey will be working alongside Callum, Sue, Richard and Rebecca who will all be directly supporting clubs to ensure they have everything they need to run successfully. TREASURERS REPORT - Graham Middleton

As I write this at the end of March 2020, the nation is almost a week into the Corona Virus lockdown. Youth Clubs are closed and all physical contact subject to social distancing rules. Due to the strength of our cash reserves we are well placed to keep our Charity intact, able to respond to the needs of its members and organise its activities for an uncertain future, until normal times return, however long that may be. There are some very difficult challenges facing us all.

In financial terms, 2019 was better than we had anticipated in that many new projects and initiatives were started; however, these did not quite keep pace with several long running activities that met their objectives and concluded. In consequence, our Restricted and Endowment Funds reduced by some £90,672. Our designated project funding also declined, for similar reasons, by £14,188. The better news is that our unrestricted General Fund increased by £62,789. Overall, therefore, an aggregate deficit was returned of £42,071 compared to 2018's surplus of £139,361.

This turnaround was much less than had been forecast. It shows a return to more "normal" times free of the exceptionally profitable distortions arising from the centrally priced NCS scheme well reported on in previous years. The reserves generated and carefully husbanded in the "boom" years will sustain us through 2020 and beyond.

Our total net assets at the end of 2019 stood at £2,760,850. Of this sum all but £856,967 is pledged to deliver Restricted and Designated funded projects. The money carried forward in these funds will pay for the staff delivering the activities and contribute towards the Charities running costs, the timescale for which will be stretched by the period the Corona Virus restrictions apply. But in our General Fund we have what we believe to be sufficient assets to afford to hold everything together for quite a while.

Of course, we shall be hoping our sponsors and benefactors will continue to be able to support us and we wish them well in coping with the economic fallout from these unprecedented threats to our respective organisations.
